DJ Fife is a member of Curve Lake First Nation with a strong passion for the Anishnaabemowin language. Fife grew up in the community and learned the language from grandparents, teachers in school and through self-study. His grasp of the language has grown strong in recent years through an active learning approach, gaining him some level of recognition in the community. This recognition resulted in the opportunity to carry the Olympic Torch representing Curve Lake First Nation during the 2010 Olympic Torch Relay. Fife is a Park Warden at Petroglyphs Provincial Park helping to preserve and promote the ceremonial, historical and educational values of the Teaching Rocks, *Kinoomaage Waapkong*.
