ANISHINAABEMOWIN ON THE LAND***

Course Description

This is a land-based language and culture course which explores Anishinaabemowin through experiential learning. The course will cover basic knowledge and history of the Anishinaabe writing system, as well as songs, chants and dances, with a special focus on environmental knowledge and human relationships in the Natural World. Students will learn basic Anishinaabe language skills and have experience in using language in a practical way toward resolving environmental issues. Students will explore the ethics of living in a good way (Bimaadiziwin), wherein individuals come to understand the importance of building relationships between people and the land.
