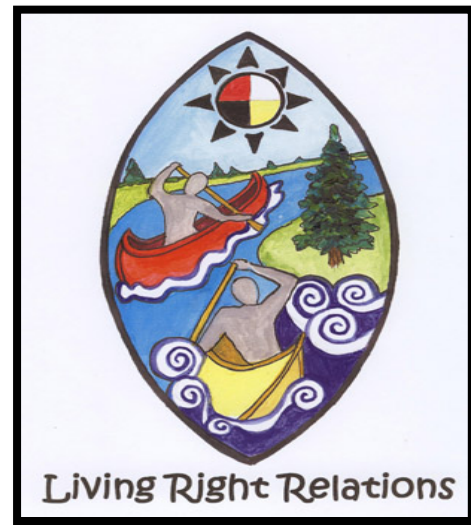


Travelling Toward Right Relations

Bay of Quinte Conference is an Affirming Conference.
