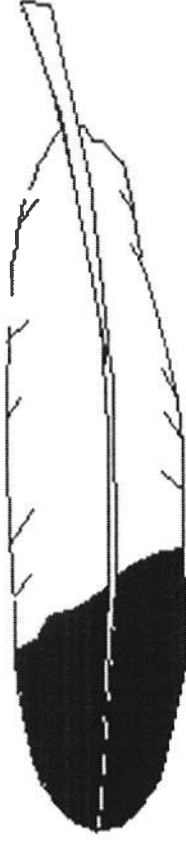

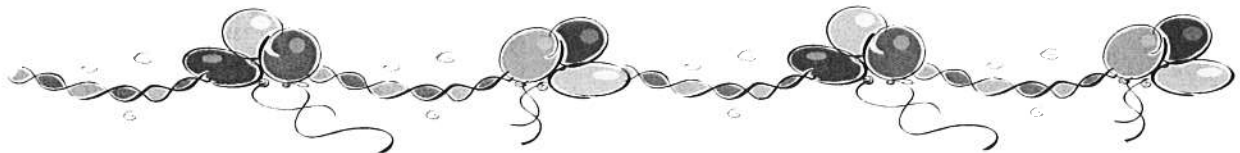

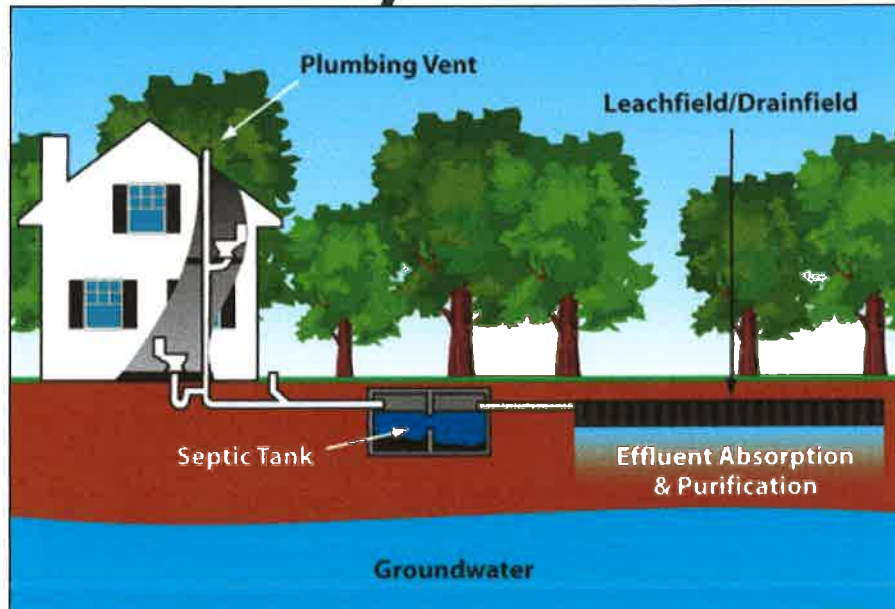

How to Care for Your Septic Tank and Septic System



Septic System Ongoing Maintenance

Taking care of your septic system isn't difficult, because modern systems function efficiently when you follow a few basic guidelines.

Put these tips to use for a clean and trouble-free septic system.

Divert Rainwater From the Septic field

- A soggy septic field won't absorb and neutralize liquid waste. Plan landscaping, roof gutters and foundation drains so that excess water is diverted away from the septic field.

Don't Overload the Septic Tank and Septic field

- Check faucets and toilets for leaks; make repairs if necessary.
- Reduce water levels for small loads of laundry.
- Wait until the dishwasher is full to run it.

Keep Trees Away from the Septic System

- Discourage root damage by keeping trees at least 100 feet away from the septic system.

- Trees with very aggressive roots, such as willows, should be even farther away from the system.

The Toilet Isn't a Garbage Disposal

- Never flush cat litter, disposable diapers, sanitary napkins, tampons, paper towels, facial tissues, coffee grounds, or cigarette butts and filters. They'll clog your septic tank in less time than you might imagine.

Minimize Heavy Duty Cleaners

- Overuse of heavy cleaners kills beneficial bacteria in the septic tank, so solids won't break down as well.

Do Not Pour Grease Down the Drain

- Grease can clog the septic field, making it impossible for soil to absorb liquids. If that happens you'll need a new septic field.

Avoid Hazardous Chemicals

- Varnish, paint thinners, motor oils, gasoline and other similar chemicals can ruin your system and are a hazard to groundwater. Dispose of them properly.

Protect the System from Damage

- Do not drive over the septic field, build a structure on top of it, or cover it with concrete or asphalt.
- Do plant grass on the septic field to minimize soil erosion.
- Do not create ice rinks on the septic field

Perform Regular Maintenance

- Solids must eventually be pumped from the tank. Many experts advise a family of four with a 1,000 gallon septic tank to have the tank pumped after 3-5 years of full time use.
- Never attempt to open a septic tank yourself. Gases and bacteria in it are dangerous.

LANDS RESOURCE CONSULTATION TRAINEE

Duties:

- Develop and implement a consultation protocol for community or local consultation and decision making relating to Lands and Resources
- Develop a multi year plan and set implementation schedule for improving consultation capacity relating to Lands and Resources
- Identify training needs for Lands and Resources Consultation Trainees as well as additional training for interested community members
- Develop Terms of Reference for and recommend consultant to deliver training session as needs require within the allocated budget
- Conduct several community and regional meetings so issues are understood by community members as well as neighboring communities
- Develop Consultation Hand Book that outlines Internal Community Consultation issues and Process to help facilitate community decision making process
- Travel to outside organizations that host meetings from time to time within our traditional territory on issues that may affect the First Nation and update Council on these issues

Court Docket

The individuals named are people who are with the APS and who are presently before the courts. We do not name young offenders, only adult criminal offenders. All of the Adult Criminal Offences are public information.

McCUE, Brydon age 19 was charged on February 14th, 2013 with Assault x 3, and Breach of Probation. On April 11th, 2013, was charged with Forcible Confinement and Assault with a weapon. Next appearance in court is on October 16th, 2013.

LANE, Wayne age 30 was charged on April 30th, 2013 with Mischief under \$5000.00. Next appearance in court is September 26th, 2013.
