### **RE: Williams Treaties Distribution**

March 18th, 2019 Council Meeting:

COUNCILLOR LAURIE HOCKADAY MOVED AND COUNCILLOR TIFFANY TAYLOR SECONDED TO APPROVE MEMBERS THAT ARE ALIVE AND ELIGIBLE BY SEPTEMBER 13, 2018 AND **HAVE HAD THEIR APPLICATION RECEIVED BY INDIGENOUS SERVICES CANADA BY DECEMBER 31, 2019** TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE CURVE LAKE WILLIAMS TREATIES FIRST NATIONS PER CAPITA DISTRIBUTION WITH NOTICES TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERSHIP. ANY FUNDS REMAINING AFTER FINAL DETERMINATION OF ELIGIBLE BENEFICIARIES WILL BE DISTRIBUTED TO MEMBERSHIP. ALL IN FAVOUR. MOTION CARRIED.

COUNCILLOR TIFFANY TAYLOR MOVED AND COUNCILLOR SHANE TAYLOR SECONDED TO APPROVE THE THRESHOLD OF **300** FOR THE WILLIAMS TREATIES FIRST NATION SETTLEMENT. ALL IN FAVOUR. MOTION CARRIED.

What does this mean? What if I was alive and eligible as of September 13, 2018 but I have not yet received my status from the Federal Government or I have not even applied yet? The above motion means that you have until December 31st, 2019 to **APPLY** for your status to still be considered for a per capita distribution should you receive status. How will you demonstrate that you have applied? At the September 9th, 2019 Council Meeting, Council has agreed upon a few different ways:

- A confirmation letter dated **on or before December 31st, 2019** from Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada showing you have applied and have been given a 10 digit file number.
- Receipt of shipping by courier services (FED EX/Purolator/UPS etc.) showing you mailed your application to Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada **on or before December 31st, 2019**
- A registered Mail Slip showing you mailed your application to Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada **on or before December 31st, 2019**
- A Tracking # (Canada Post) showing you mailed your application to Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada **on or before December 31st, 2019**

To be eligible for consideration for WTFN PCD please bring one of the above noted verification methods of application to the Curve Lake Government Services building on or before:

**Friday, January 31st, 2020.**

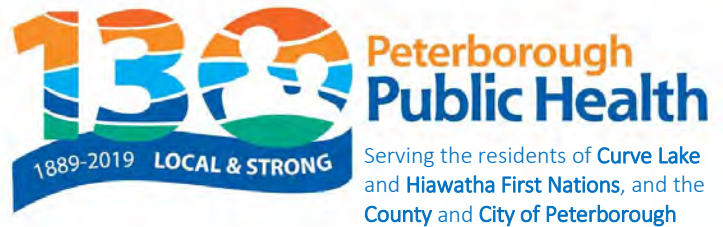

# Well Water Testing Service Paused for Winter

## *Service Resumes Spring 2020 in Two Northern County Townships*

Peterborough Public Health and the Municipality of Trent Lakes and Township of North Kawartha are pausing their joint well water sample drop-off program for the winter. The final date for county residents to drop off their samples to the Trent Lakes Administration office and the Township of North Kawartha Administration office is Thursday, November 28, 2019.

Free well water drop-off service will return next year at both locations, early in April 2020 and will run until late November. Throughout the winter months, residents may drop off their samples at Peterborough Public Health, 185 King St. in Peterborough, between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday, and from 8:30 a.m. to 12 noon on Fridays, or at the Public Health Ontario Laboratory at 99 Hospital Drive between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

It is important to test well water a number of times throughout the year. "Sampling water from your well is the best way to ensure that the water is free of pathogens, which can cause illness if consumed. Water quality can change over time, so we recommend that residents test private wells three to four times a year to prevent health risks. We hope by making this testing service more accessible that residents will test their well water more regularly," said Julie Ingram, Manager of Environmental Health Programs at Peterborough Public Health. "We look forward to resuming our courier service with the municipalities in the spring so it's easy for residents to submit well water tests."

Well water samples are tested for two types of bacterial contamination: total coliforms and *E. coli*. The presence of *E. coli* indicates the water has been contaminated with fecal material, which can contain disease-causing microbes. These organisms can cause severe gastrointestinal illness. Anyone can become ill if they consume contaminated water, but the young, elderly, and immuno-compromised are at a higher risk.

After samples are submitted, residents will receive water quality results by mail or they can call Public Health Ontario's Interactive Voice Response at 1-877-723-3426. For a free consultation about water quality test results, call the Peterborough Public Health's Safe Water Program at 705-743-1000, ext. 232.

## GAS CARD CHANGES

Effective January 1, 2020, the Ontario Gas Card will be discontinued

### What is new as of January 1, 2020?

Instead of the Ontario Gas Card, First Nation people will be able to use their Indian Status card (Status card), which is issued by the Government of Canada, as proof of entitlement to buy gasoline exempt of Ontario gasoline tax.

First Nation individuals will be able to use the version of the card that they currently have in their possession (or may apply to the Government of Canada to obtain a Status card if they currently are not in possession of a Status card).

- As proof of entitlement to buy tax-exempt gasoline at on-reserve retailers, First Nation individuals will use their:
  - Certificate of Indian Status Card, including the laminated Certificate of Indian Status Card with no renewal date;
  - Secure Certificate of Indian Status Card; or
  - Temporary Confirmation of Registration Document.



Band councils, tribal councils, and band-empowered entities will use an Ontario issued unique identifier number issued by the Ontario Ministry of Finance.

Authorized retailers will no longer accept the Ontario Gas Card. The Ontario Ministry of Finance will no longer issue the Ontario Gas Card.

### What does this mean for on-reserve gasoline retailers?

The Ontario Ministry of Finance (MOF) will be working with gasoline retailers in the months leading up to the January 1, 2020 effective date to ensure they are prepared.

Retailers who request refunds electronically from MOF will follow the same steps. Federal Status Cards will be validated at point-of-sale in near real time, and for valid cards, the transaction will be completed.

For those retailers who are filing manually, they may continue to file manually. There will be a new process implemented January 1, 2020 that is similar to the process they are currently using to file their claims. Ontario will help retailers transition smoothly to the updated process.

### Is there a minimum age?

As of January 1, 2020, Children under 16 years of age will be able to use their own or their parent's Status Cards to purchase gasoline for their exclusive use (e.g. snowmobiles, ATVs).

### Will individuals need a new federally issued card or can members use existing ones?

No, individuals are not required to obtain a new Status Card. They should be able to use the Status Cards in their possession to purchase gasoline exempt of gasoline tax.

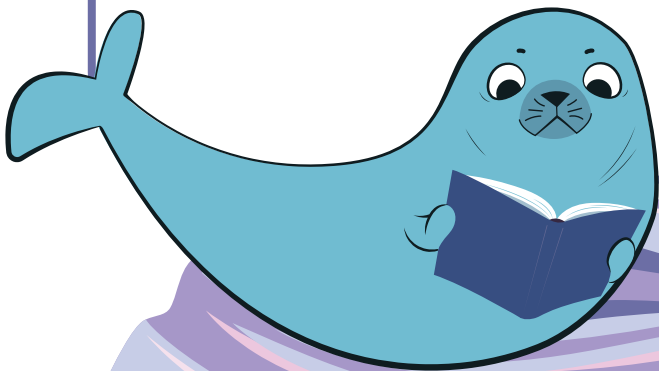
