Curve Lake First Nation Vaccination Rate within Community as of June 2nd, 2021:

- 71% of all residents 18+ were fully vaccinated in Curve Lake First Nation (Community Centre Clinics), based on a population estimate of 1100.
- Vaccination clinics for 12-18 YO on June 8, 2021 and June 29, 2021. Approximately 100 youth vaccinated at the first clinic.

Notable Changes to and key PROVINCIAL Measures in Place as of June 30th, 2021:

- Stay at home order lifted as of June 2nd, 2021
- Outdoor social gatherings and organized public events for up to 25 people
- Indoor social gatherings and organized public events for up to 5 people
- Outdoor dining for up to 6 people per table
- Essential and other select retail at 50% capacity
- Non-essential retail at 25% capacity. Stores in shopping malls open, with restrictions
- Indoor religious services, rites, or ceremonies, including wedding services and funeral services at 25% capacity
- Overnight camps
- Personal care services where face coverings can be worn, 25% capacity
- Outdoor amusement and waterparks at 25% capacity
- Outdoor sports games, leagues and events at 25% capacity
- Outdoor cinemas, performing arts, live music events and attractions at 25% capacity







- Exercise our inherent and treaty rights (William's Treaty Area)
- Recreation areas including trails, ball diamonds, beaches, boardwalks, docks, playgrounds, boat launch, boating
- Outdoor gatherings permitted maximum of 12 socially distanced
- MONITORED outdoor activities 20 people + staff. Must notify CLFN administration and packages will be provided for safe execution
- Indoor gatherings permitted, maximum of 5 people, masks recommended
- Religious, wedding and funeral service (indoors maximum of 12, outdoors – capacity to allow for 2-meter distancing)
- Curve Lake First Nation Programming:
 - o Curve Lake First Nation School and Early Learning Centre virtual and in-person learning
 - o Curve Lake First Nation Council meeting in person in rotating cohorts
 - o Many programs only offered virtually
- Lessee's and those owning property in trailer parks and coming for the entire summer are welcome to return to CL with the understanding that they are to quarantine for 14 days and sign a declaration.
- Health and Safety measures apply to all businesses within Curve Lake First Nation. 20% Capacity allowed.

Indoor Gatherings	Maximum of 12, socially distanced and masks recommended	If less than 2-meter distanced 
Outdoor Gatherings	Maximum of 25, socially distanced	If less than 2-meter distanced 
Indoor religious weddings and funerals or traditional ceremonies	Maximum of 25 people, social distanced, masked	Yes 
Outdoor religious, weddings and funerals or traditional ceremonies	Capacity limit to allow for 2-meter social distance	If less than 2-meter distanced 
CLFN Staff return to work on-site	Return to work plans to be put in place, based on the staff member's comfort level and ability to return. Social distancing and masks required. Resumption of Membership (Status Card) Services and finance services via pay window.	Yes, in Shared spaces 
In-Person Council & Committee Meetings	Council and committees resume in-person with 6 people, keeping 2-meter distancing. Council meeting by-weekly, with the off week reserved for emergency Covid business. Options to meet outdoors, when appropriate.	Yes, until seated 
Monitored outdoor activities	45 people + staff. Must notify CLFN administration and packages will be provided for safe execution (masks, contact tracing forms, sanitizer, etc.)	As needed 
Retail Stores	Retailers can welcome customers, up to 50% capacity	Yes 
Seasonal Lessee's	Lessee's and those owning property in trailer parks are welcome to return to CL with the understanding that they are to bring their own supplies and stay on their property. Guests are to follow the same restrictions (maximum of 10 people per property).	N/A 
Flag Response System	Flag response discontinues as of July 7, 2021. Food and water will continue to be available to those in isolation due to COVID-19.	N/A 
Daily Situation Report	Reduce the daily situation report to weekdays only. To be reinstated on weekends in urgent and emergent conditions.	N/A 

Notes:

- These measures are being recommended for members and residents of CLFN who have received BOTH COVID-19 vaccines.
- Public spaces have limited public health measures in place. It is everyone's responsibility to practice preventative measures.
- We will continue to monitor the COVID-19 situation in the immediate health region, that we rely on for goods and services, as well as throughout the province. These numbers and restrictions may change based on regional and provincial COVID and vaccination rates.
- These restrictions will be reevaluated on July 20th.
- If our circumstance changes our Community will revert to the current Provincial Measures immediately
