MEMBERSHIP TRANSFER – NOTICE OF VOTE

INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE REGISTERED STATUS INDIANS UNDER THE *INDIAN ACT* AND BELONG TO ANOTHER FIRST NATION ARE ENTITLED TO BE TRANSFERRED TO CURVE LAKE FIRST NATION IF THE MAJORITY OF VOTES CAST BY ELIGIBLE VOTERS, VOTE IN FAVOUR OF ACCEPTING THE INDIVIDUAL. MEMBERSHIP TRANSFERS ARE ONLY VOTED ON DURING A CURVE LAKE FIRST NATION GENERAL ELECTION.

WE HAVE FOUR REQUESTS:

 REQUESTS TRANSFER FROM OPASKWAYAK CREE NATION TO CURVE LAKE FIRST NATION.

- 3. RYCKMAN, ROBERT
 REQUESTS TRANSFER FROM MORAVIAN OF THE THAMES FIRST NATION TO CURVE LAKE FIRST NATION.
- 4. THOMPSON, CINDY
 REQUESTS TRANSFER FROM M'CHIGEENG FIRST NATION TO CURVE LAKE FIRST NATION.

Attached are letters from the above-named individuals requesting a transfer.

There are three (3) methods in which members may vote. In person at the polling station on **June 20**th, **2022**, electronic via OneFeather (https://onefeather.ca/nations/curvelake) or through mail-in ballot.

All off reserve eligible voting members (of whom we have a current address) will receive a mail-in voting package. It is the members/voters' responsibility to provide Curve Lake First Nation with their current mailing address. Currently I am a member of the Opaskwayak Cree Nation from The Pas Manitoba. I have been a member there since 2016 as I did not have status prior due to my mother having lost her status due to the whole residential school fiasco that happened through the 50's-70's. She finally had her status reinstated in 2015 and I was then able to get mine. My initial paper work and status card was actually all done through your office at that time in 2016.

My mother's birth parents/my maternal grandparents were from The Pas (whom have long passed and so I never met). I myself have never been to The Pas and most likely never will as I reside in Buckhorn Ontario, with no plans on moving as I built a new house in 2014, this is planned to be the house I grow old in.

Since gaining status I have been trying to learn the history of Indigenous people and to be more active and support Indigenous persons. Recently I have joined ION (Indigenous Opportunities in Nuclear) group and support their initiative to get more Indigenous into the good paying jobs available in the nuclear power industry. I myself am currently employed at the Darlington Nuclear Generating Station where we have a sharing circle of ION candidates where we can meet and discuss matters that affect our work and personal lives as well as cultural concerns.

I would like to become a member of Curve Lake First Nation for several reasons. It is the closest to where I live so geographically most convenient. I would like to be able to help other members where I can. A want to learn more of culture, history and what it is like to be Indigenous person with the support of the band being close. At the moment any questions I have asked, I am told to ask my band. So I call the band and then they tell me well you should come in to discuss this. What does that even mean? Right now I have a vague understanding of what we have as rights as Indigenous people but no solid answers.

I felt as though you should know a little bit about the reasons I want to join your band and so apologize if it was lengthy.
